

Once upon a time I would stay up all



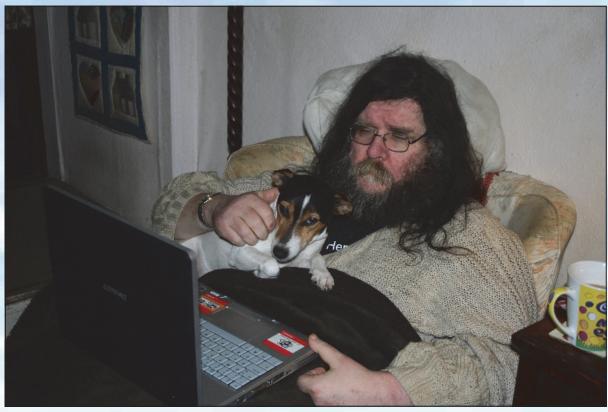

What a pity. I am very sad for the loss of the dissolute libertine who seems to have vanished about five years ago. Around about the time I turned 60, and probably before. It's just been fine out over the years that the most advanced mammalian species are those who remain in the juvenile form for longest. "Heat of the Moment," the rock hit by Asia that dominated the radio in summer

1982, started far different from its final form.

"It was a country song on the piano," recalls Asia keyboardist Geoff Downes. "John [Wetton, Asia's original lead singer and bassist] had this chorus. We sat down at the piano one day and said let's try and do something with it. It was actually the last song we recorded for the album, which is amazing. It had a summer sound to it, so we were very lucky in that respect."

That self-titled debut by Asia, an English supergroup comprised of progrock and new wave thoroughbreds, topped the Billboard albums chart for nine weeks and went on to become 1982's biggest selling album. "Heat of the Moment" was a top five single.

Asia's sleek sound, with Journey's producer Mike Stone behind the console, wasn't what some beardstroking critics expected from a supergroup comprised of Yes guitarist Steve Howe, Emerson, Lake & Palmer drummer Carl Palmer, King Crimson expat Wetton, and Downes from "Video Killed the Radio Star" icons The Buggles.

Fausto 1948 - 2024


Carlos Fausto Bordalo Gomes Dias. OL, known mononymously as Fausto, was a Portuguese composer, guitarist and singer. Fausto formed his first band Os Rebeldes in the former Portuguese overseas province. He released his first album in Lisbon at 20, winning the Revelation Award in 1969. associated with influential names like José Afonso and Manuel Freire and shifted from protest songs to traditional Portuguese music after the Carnation Fausto Revolution. released recordings between 1970 and 2011 before passing away in 2024 in Lisbon.



Laurie Lindeen 1962 - 2024

Laurie Lindeen was an American writer and musician, playing as a member of the Zuzu's Petals. Zuzu's Petals was a notable all-female band in local clubs, recording a debut cassette before they released two albums under Twin/Tone Records. Lindeen later focused on writing and earned a master's degree in creative writing. She still occasionally performed, though she moved to offering writing lessons in Minneapolis. In 2007, she published her memoir Petal Pusher: A Rock and Roll Cinderella Story.

Nino Vella 1992 - 2024

Nino Vella was a French composer, pianist, singer, and music producer. Vella started studying music at age six, first focusing on classical and jazz before exploring electronic music at 11 in a home studio. He joined his first bands at 14. Vella started by composing original music for plays before

Cliff Waldron 1941 - 2024

Clifford Waldron was an American bluegrass musician. Waldron is best known for his collaborations with bluegrass musician Bill Emerson, with the two forming the bluegrass duo Emerson & Waldron, as well as the formation of his

own band, Cliff Waldron and the New Shades Of Grass. The band released successful albums until the mid-1970s, after which Waldron worked for the National Park Service. Despite this, he continued to occasionally perform music at his church and record private gospel music. In 1975, Waldron became dedicated to religion and released two gospel albums. After retiring in 1996, he returned to bluegrass music and recorded four new albums from 1998 to 2003. He died on July 1, 2024, in Virginia, at the age of 83.



Tom Fowler 1941 - 2024


Thomas W. Fowler was an American bass guitarist. He began playing the violin at a young age before transitioning to the upright bass and finally the electric bass. He performed with various artists such as Frank Zappa, Ray Charles, and Steve Hackett. Fowler also played with his siblings in the band Air Pocket. Fowler died on July 2, 2024, at the age of 73, following complications from an aneurysm.



Liana Isakadze ლიანა ისაკაძე Лиана Исакадзе 1946 - 2024

Liana Alexandres asuli Isakadze was a prominent Georgian violinist and


conductor. Following a career as a violin soloist with leading orchestras throughout Europe, she served as conductor of the Georgian State Chamber Orchestra and in 1988 was recognized as the People's Artist of the USSR – the youngest musician in the history of the Soviet Union to obtain that title. After 2011, Liana established the "Virtuosi from Facebook" orchestra with renowned musicians from different countries. Their first shows were at Liana Isakadze Festivals in Batumi. Her death was announced on 5 July 2024.



Giuseppe Chierchia 1952 - 2024

Giuseppe Chierchia, known professionally as Pino D'Angiò, was an Italo disco artist. He was best known for his 1980 hit song, "Ma quale idea". In 1979, D'Angiò made his recording debut with the single "È libero, scusi?". He gained international success in 1980 with his hit song "Ma quale

idea", selling over two million copies. Throughout his career, he released more singles and albums in a similar style. Besides music, he also worked as a TV and radio presenter, and on occasion, composed songs for other artists. In his later years D'Angiò faced multiple health issues, including throat cancer, lung cancer, and a stroke. In 2024, he participated in the Sanremo Music Festival. He died on 6 July 2024, at the age of 71.



Paul Sperry 1934 - 2024

Paul John Sperry was an American lyric tenor. He was known for performing classical and contemporary music at numerous theaters and concerts. He earned his B.S. and M.S. degrees at Harvard


University. He was a lyric tenor and a recitalist, and later a faculty member at Juilliard School during the 1980s. Sperry died of heart failure in Manhattan, on June 13, 2024, at the age of 90.



Martti Wallén 1948 - 2024

Martti Wallén was a Finnish operatic bass singer. Born in Helsinki, he performed both internationally and in his native country where he was a visiting soloist at the Finnish National Opera for many years. He created the role of the Judge in the world premiere of Aulis Sallinen's The Horseman at the Savonlinna Opera Festival in 1975. He was a member of the Royal Swedish

Opera from 1975 to 2000. Wallen died in Sineu on 29 June 2024, at the age of 75.



Lucius Banda 1970 - 2024

Lucius Chicco Banda, better known by his stage name Soldier Lucius Banda, was a Malawian singer-songwriter, music producer and politician. Lucius Banda began his music career in 1983 at the age of 13, singing with his brother Paul Banda and the Alleluya Band. He furthered his music education by attending a music school in South Africa in 1993. He recorded his first album, "Son of a Poor Man," and in 1997, formed his own band, Zembani, with the goal of promoting local musicians in Malawi. His political career brought challenges, such as being convicted of having fake academic qualifications and serving time in prison. However, he was able to bounce back and even regain a seat

in parliament in 2014. Throughout his career, he released numerous albums and was involved in international performances that brought attention to the political situation in Malawi. Latterly, Banda faced health issues, including high blood pressure and kidney failure. Banda died of renal failure at Sunninghill Hospital in South Africa, aged 53.



Kong Nay គង់ ណៃ 1944 - 2024 Kong Nay, also known as Kong Nai, was a Cambodian musician from Kampot Province known for playing the traditional chapei dang veng (a Cambodian twostringed, long-necked guitar that is usually plucked). He won the 2017 Fukuoka Arts and Culture Prize for his contributions to music. Blinded by smallpox at a young age, Kong Nay learned to play the chapei by mimicking the sounds he heard in his village. He quickly became proficient and started playing professionally at the age of 18. After winning a national chapei competition in 1991, he received a monthly salary and land in Phnom Penh. In declining health towards the end of his life, Kong Nay passed away on 28 June at the age of 80 in 2024.



Lando Bartolini 1937 - 2024

Lando Bartolini was an Italian operatic tenor who appeared internationally at major opera houses and festivals. After studies in Philadelphia, he made his debut there in 1968, and received international attention in 1973 in Mascagni's Iris at the Liceu in

Barcelona. He was a member of the New York City Opera from 1976 to 1979, and performed at the Arena di Verona between 1983 and 1998. With a spinto voice, he focused on Italian opera from bel canto to verismo, appearing in 49 roles. He died at his home in the Pistoia mountains on 28 June 2024, after a prolonged illness.



Alexander Knaifel Алекса́ндр Кна́йфель 1943 - 2024

Alexander Aronovich Knaifel was a Soviet composer from Tashkent, Uzbekistan, known for his operas The Ghost of

Canterville and Alice in Wonderland as well as for his music for cinema. He produced over 80 compositions in various genres and more than 40 film scores. Some of his works, such as Agnus Dei, Nika, and Solaris, showcase his unique approach to music composition. He later faced being blacklisted in 1979, for participating in Western music festivals.



Gary Grant n.d. - 2024

Gary E. Grant was an American trumpet player, composer and producer, and session musician. After graduation, he toured with the Woody Herman band as a lead trumpet player and featured soloist. Gary spent

three years in Hawaii before moving to Los Angeles in 1975 to pursue a career as a full-time musician. He played with his own big band and 7 piece ensemble, recorded with Quincy Jones, and was a member of the Jerry Hey Horns. During his career, Grant has played on hundreds of commercial recordings.



Ray St. Germain 1940 - 2024

Ray St. Germain, OM, was a Canadian singer, author, and television host known for his work on various television shows, including Time for Living and Big Sky Country. He also ran for federal office in 2006 as a Liberal candidate. St. Germain

was an active voice actor, working on children's series like Tipi Tales. He was a founding member of the Alberta Old Tyme Fiddlers' Association and hosted over 600 television shows on different networks. St. Germain received numerous awards for his contributions to Canadian culture, including the Order of Manitoba and induction into the Canadian Country Music Hall of Fame. He entertained Canadian Forces overseas and was highly involved in promoting Métis culture through his work with APTN. St. Germain passed away on 25 June 2024, aged 83.



John DeFrancesco 1940 - 2024

"Papa" John DeFrancesco was an American jazz organist and vocalist, and father of musicians Joey DeFrancesco and Johnny DeFrancesco. His discography includes several albums released from 1993 to 2011. He passed away on June 25, 2024.




Jewel Brown 1937 - 2024

Jewel Brown was an American jazz and blues singer. She began her career at a young age by performing in clubs in Galveston and Houston. She later joined Louis Armstrong's band in the 1960s and performed with notable artists like Dizzy Gillespie. In 2007, Brown was inducted into the Blues Smithsonian Hall of Fame. She passed away on June 25, 2024, at the age of 86, due to colon cancer.



Gunnar Stubseid 1948 - 2024

Gunnar Stubseid was a Norwegian educator, folk musician, writer, and magazine editor. He played the Hardanger fiddle and was part of the music group Slinkombas. They released two albums, one of which won a Spellemannprisen award. Stubseid also edited the magazine Spelemannsbladet and wrote several books, including a biography of folk musician Sigbjørn Bernhoft Osa. He served as rector at the Ole Bull Academy from 2003 to 2011. He died in June 2024, at 76 years old.



Shifty Shellshock 1974 - 2024

Seth Brooks Binzer, better known by his stage name Shifty Shellshock, was an American rapper and singersongwriter who cofounded the rap rock band Crazy Town, known for their hit song "Butterfly". He later had a solo career as well. Binzer released his only solo album, Happy Love Sick, in 2004. In July 2010, Binzer's new group, Shifty and the Big Shots, released their first single, "Save Me".

Binzer struggled with addiction throughout his career and appeared on the reality television series Celebrity Rehab and Sober House. Binzer was found dead at his home in Los Angeles on June 24, 2024, at the age of 49, from an accidental drug overdose.



Betty Veldpaus 1952 - 2024

Betty Veldpaus was a Dutch musician, known for the country and pop band Pussycat, fronted with sisters Toni and Marianne. Their song "Mississippi" was a number one hit in most European countries, including the UK, in 1975/6. Their career in Europe spanned more than a decade and included some seventeen albums. In 2001, the compilation album 25 Years After Mississippi was released and reached the charts. In 2005, the band recorded "Somewhere Someone" with Major Dundee and contributed background vocals to a Dutch reggae cover in 2007. In 2023, unreleased demos were released as the album "Unreleased Demos 1983." On 28 June 2024, Betty Veldpaus died at the age of 72.

Whenever anything comes my way via UK Super Producer Configa, you can

bet that there is always a fellow legendary name in Hip Hop attached and this one is no different. Jolicoeur is the hot new release from what is Hip Hop's first Rapper/Producer PhD collaboration, yes indeed both Configa and veteran UK Emcee Tommy Evans, both have a PhD.



If you are familiar with the blog then you will know my previous reviews for Configa and be well acquainted with the main man himself, who has worked with the likes of Arrested Development, Chuck D and Big Daddy Kane alongside his producer albums but, this will be the first time I have featured Tommy Evans. I am not going to give you a huge lowdown on him but, for those of you who might not be familiar with his work; he was born in Leeds before making London his home. Introduced to Hip Hop in the early eighties, he began rapping seriously in 1995 and was linked with a number of crews before forming Junkyard Tactics in 1996. After JYT supported De La Soul in 1997, Tommy went solo in 1998, and linked up with the YNR Crew in Huddersfield before making his debut on Jehst's 1999 "Premonitions EP" with the track Deadly Combination. Since that time he has dropped his own releases via YNR, his own label run with Jehst and Cee-Why, and worked along some of the UK's best. His debut album, New Years Revolutions, came in 2004 on YNR. It is impossible for me to list collaborations and Tommy's achievements here but just know that it is extensive and worldwide. I followed many of the YNR releases myself back in the late 90's and early 2000's, so it is truly a pleasure to feature his work here.

The album Jolicoeur, meaning A Gallant Heart, is a homage to the late Dave of De La Soul but encapsulates the artistic ethos and authenticity of both Configa Tommy Evans. The project features appearances from Speech (Arrested Development), Sarah Sayed (Lebanese-American Poet), Matthew Allman and Malala, alongside some of London's emerging vocal talents including Doella, Glorynade, Nyotaa, Tay-Shan, and VVN, there is even an appearance from another legendary UK emcee in the form of Kyza. You really get the sense, even before listening, that this album is shaping up to be something special, if maybe a little different.

However, there is only one way to know that for sure and that is to follow me as I take you through my impressions of the album.

The album begins with Summertime which features Matthew Configa brings this stunning funk fuelled beat that has bass, guitars, and keys, all of which combine to give a vibe that is the very definition of how summer sounds. Matthew Allmans soulful vocals are like an audible summer breeze, cooling you from the heat. Tommy Evans brings some uplifting vocals that takes us on brief but enjoyable trip through the summer months, letting us know that it's all about the things that uplift you and bring a smile to your face. That smile remains firmly planted on your face as the bass, drums and keys of Every Situation keeps the vibe going with an infectious sound that keeps you moving. This one sees Tommy Evans speaking on how you see yourself and the outcome of the situations you find yourself in every day. It's all about keeping a positive outlook as you go into each one, even seeing yourself already living in the best possible outcome and keeping that faith as you walk forward.



This one really has that revolutionary vibe to it, which really reflects the feelings of so many of us in today's society. All round the world people are becoming fed up with the narratives imposed on them by the ruling elite and are standing up to be heard and to fight for their rights as free people. Straight after that feeling of the energy of millions of people all around the world coming together Getaway is about the opposite and brings keys, drums and bass to the table with a vibe that brings your focus back to the self with the jazzy vocals of Doella. This



one really does look at taking time for yourself, doing whatever it takes to ground yourself and bring you back into who you truly are, because the world around you often gets too much with the constant influx of negative stimulus and just being you again is the best way to reset, regardless of how you achieve it...

We Made It features Tay-Shan and Sarah Sayad, Configa brings us the kind of uplifting sound that is reminiscent of his work with Arrested Development, bringing an infectious vibe you can't help but move to. Tay-Shan's soulful vocals, Sarah Sayad's poetry and Tommy Evans' lyrics all merge to bring you a vibe that brings

those good feelings to the forefront as it lifts you up, making you think about all that you have achieved yourself, and invites you to really feel good about those moments because they made you who you are and put you in this place, in the here and now, so be proud of that because you made it too. Thunder and the sound of rain herald the arrival of The Water, featuring Glorynade, this one has drums and keys that bring a more Lo-Fi Hip Hop vibe, inviting you to listen a little bit more. In fact, this one invites you to think more about the part water plays in our lives and just how much our experiences with water so often mirror so many of life's experiences. Water is critical to our survival, but it can also be detrimental if



we drink too much; water can also help us travel to places or we can drown in it. We have to respect the part water plays in our lives and treat it with the respect it deserves.

Keep The Faith features Kyza and Nyotaa and has strings alongside the bass and drums, bringing a soulful vibe that you want to close your eyes to and just feel it. The message here is just to keep the faith that all will be ok. There are so many challenges that we are presented with in our day-to-day lives that it is easy to give up or look for the easy way out, but the important thing is to stay in a positive frame of mind and know that the brighter days are coming and soon enough the sun will shine on you. There is this mariachi guitar vibe on Senoritas, alongside a nice head nod beat too of course, that gets you in a reflective mood. VVN brings some chilled soul vibes here as it is all about how that special someone can bring so much to your life, bringing maturity and love. This one also made me reflect on just what feminine energy can bring to your life, you just have to be open to it.

The penultimate track is Memory Lane which features Doella's jazzy vocals once more. Configa brings strings, bass and drums, creating a chilled feel-good sound. Tommy Evans takes us on an uplifting trip down his own memory lane, giving us a great insight into some of the experiences he has had along the way. As you listen, it kind of makes you cast your own mind back to some of those moments that were perhaps life defining or just those which you enjoyed, bringing a smile to your face again. The last track is Love Like This, which features Malala and has this big uplifting sound that will have you moving regardless. You can't get more uplifting than love, and when you can express love for all that is around you, that is something special but, as Tommy says, when you can truly love yourself, then that is a love unlike anything you have ever felt until that moment. So, walk through life expressing love for all you see around you because the more love you give out, the more you will receive.



Now, it is not often that you will listen to an album that uplifts you and keeps you there throughout its duration, but Jolicoeur does just that, it really is a triumph in feel-good music. It really is hard to say anything more about this than it is a true pleasure to listen to. From start to finish, Jolicoeur raises you right up and holds you there, keeping you in this state of near euphoria. The energy seems to eminate from both the music and the lyrics and gives you the feeling that this album has been infused with good vibes. This album is like lighting a good incense, it fills your mind, body and soul with positive vibes, just like the way the incense fills the room with an uplifting aroma.

Configa proves, yet again, why he is one of THE go to Hip Hop producers as he brings the kind of uplifting energy infused beats that you just don't want to turn off, which is really hard when you are trying to review because you don't want to pause the track or stop it to keep writing. Jim is elated, but David becomes concerned that stealing so many valuables from the gang will get them tracked down and killed. They decide to return to apartment to clean up, preparation to leave, and David locks the safe behind him as the two

go back upstairs.

In the apartment, David, becomes empathetic for the surviving female hostage. She asks David to call her husband, so she can make sure that her 3-year-old son is taken care of— David agrees and the woman has a very brief conversation with whoever answers the phone. They break down the drillbit and discuss what is left to be done before they leave. When Jim and David return to the safe. Jim discovers that David not only re-locked the safe door, but the combination also erased numbers. Enraged, Jim threatens David at gunpoint, forcing him to open the safe. The valuables are loaded into bags and Jim begins loading bags into their van. But when David goes to kill the woman, he gets cold feet and shoots Jim instead. After a brief shootout, Jim is finally killed.

David returns all the valuables back into the safe and loads the woman hostage into the van, promising her that he will release her when they get far enough away from the city. As they are driving on a deserted stretch of road, the van surrounded bv other vehicles. including a contractor's truck marked with a company's phone number the same phone number that the woman had David call earlier. David attempts to identify himself as a police officer, but he is shot dead, and the movie closes with physical evidence from the car and heist being catalogued and stored in the Evidence Management building where David and Jim used to work.



Plot

During World War II, the Germans transformed Colditz Castle into a high security prisoner-of-war camp called Oflag IV-C. Its purpose was to restrain those Allied prisoners who had attempted to escape from other Oflags and so Colditz housed various nationalities who mainly British, Dutch, French and Polish. Among the British prisoners are Pat Reid and Senior British Officer Colonel Richmond. by the Richmond warned is

Kommandant that "escaping is verboten" but Richmond has no intention of heeding this advice. All the prisoners are wary of Priem, the chief security officer, who is efficient and tenacious.

Reid and other British officers attempt to open a manhole cover one night but are foiled by a simultaneous French attempt which alerts the German guards. Reid and La Tour argue about the lack of co-operation. both blaming the other. Later, a British tunnel is making progress until it meets another being dug by the Dutch a collapse officers and occurs. Richmond decides to act proposes the creation bv each nationality of escape officers who must liaise at all times to make sure attempts do not interfere with each other. This would be on understanding that the escape officers



do not themselves take part in an escape. Reid accepts the post for the British contingent. Soon afterwards, Winslow is hidden among palliasses being taken out of the castle and is not immediately caught.

Richmond gains agreement for his own escape plan which hinges on his impersonation of a feldwebel called Franz Josef. This seems to be succeeding until, at the key moment. the German quards emerge and arrest all concerned. Tyler is shot and wounded. Richmond, Reid and a dozen others are placed in solitary for a month and the likelihood of an informer is first discussed. This turns out to be the case when one of the Polish officers, whose family have been threatened by the Gestapo, is found to be collaborating with the guards and betraying escape plans.

After two weeks on the run, Winslow is recaptured and returned to Colditz. While he is in the solitary compound, he talks to La Tour during a physical exercise session and watches as La Tour, helped by a compatriot, leaps over the barbed wire fence. Winslow runs into a guard to stop him shooting La Tour runs to freedom. Richmond expresses afterwards, annoyance that no British officer has yet made a complete escape.

Reid's friend McGill approaches Richmond with a new plan but says he will only disclose it if Richmond will relieve Reid from his escape officer duties so that McGill and Reid can make the attempt together. Richmond agrees and McGill convinces Reid that the plan is feasible. The escapees will be disguised as German officers but will approach the guards from the direction of the German mess. McGill argues that previous attempts have failed because the escapees came from the wrong direction. The attempt will coincide with a revue being staged in the castle theatre, to which all senior German officers are being invited.

McGill tall is very and has antagonised the guards many times behaviour. by reckless Richmond realises will that he be too conspicuous and asks him to stand down so that other officers including Reid will have a good chance of making the plan work. McGill accepts Richmond's reasoning but devastated. Next day, he attempts to scale the wire fence surrounding the exercise compound and is shot dead by the guards. Reid, on learning of Richmond's decision, says he will not let the escape attempt proceed but Richmond persuades him to do it for McGill's sake. The escape goes ahead as planned while the revue is being staged. Four men get out of the castle but two are soon recaptured. Several days later. Richmond receives a postcard with a cryptic Не message. announces to the assembled and cheering prisoners Winslow Reid and have successfully crossed into neutral Switzerland.

Plot

In St. Petersburg, Florida, sevenyear-old Mary Adler, a mathematical genius, lives with her uncle and de facto guardian, Frank. Her best friend is her 43-year-old neighbor, Roberta Taylor. Frank, a former philosophy professor now boat mechanic, feels strongly that Mary should attend a normal elementary school so she can have a normal childhood.

On her first day of first grade, she shows remarkable mathematical talent, which impresses her teacher, Bonnie Stevenson. Bonnie tries to ask Frank about it but he tries to pass it off as the Trachtenberg system until Bonnie tricks Mary into completing a college math test, and confronts Frank again. It emerges that Mary's mother, Diane, had been a promising mathematician, dedicated to the Navier—Stokes

problem (one of the unsolved Millennium Prize Problems) before committing suicide when Mary was six months old. Mary has lived with Frank ever since.

Despite Mary's initial disdain for average children her own age and her boredom with their classwork, she begins to bond with them when she brings her one-eyed cat, Fred, for show-and-tell. Later, she defends a classmate from a bully on the school bus, something that Frank is not concerned about. After the incident, principal, having discovered Mary's math talent, encourages Frank to send Mary to a private school for gifted children, offering the opportunity of a scholarship. However, Frank turns it down, based on his family's experiences with similar schools.

principal contacts Frank's The estranged Mary's mother and maternal grandmother, Evelyn. Evelyn, а former mathematician herself, is of the opinion that people with capabilities such as Mary's have an obligation to use their talents to further help society and therefore feels that Mary should be specially tutored in preparation for a life devoted to mathematics, much as Diane was. But Frank is adamant that his sister would want Mary to be in a normal school and have the childhood she did not have. Evelyn later sues him for full custody.

While Evelyn is on the stand in court, it is revealed that she kept Diane socially isolated and forced her to be completely focused on mathematics. When Diane and her teenage boyfriend ran away to a ski resort, Evelyn threatened to charge him with kidnapping, forcing him to break up with Diane. Diane attempted suicide for the first time shortly after, which Evelyn argues was an isolated incident.

When Frank takes the stand, he admits working at a low-paying job without health insurance. His lawyer, worried that the judge will side with Evelyn who has a better financial situation, encourages Frank to take a deal offered by Evelyn's lawyer. Mary would be placed in foster care and attend the private school dictated by Evelyn. The foster parents live 25 minutes from Frank's home, he will be entitled to scheduled visits, and Mary will be able to decide where she wants to live after her 12th birthday.

Devastated at being placed in foster care, Mary refuses to see Frank when he visits. Later, he learns that Fred was put up for adoption. Frank realizes that Evelyn, who is allergic to cats, is overseeing Mary's education in the foster home.

Frank goes to the foster home and reconciles with Mary. He reveals to Evelyn that Diane had completed the Navier-Stokes Problem which Evelyn was obsessed with and pushed her to solve. However, Diane instructed Frank to publish the equation only after Evelyn's death, which reveals her deep resentment for her mother. Frank offers Evelyn the opportunity to publish Diane's work in exchange for Mary's custody, to which she agrees. Mary is placed back in Frank's custody, she socializes with children her age while taking college-level courses.

It's a simple, straightforward film, but sometimes that's all you need as long as its heart is true.

Plot

A 19-year-old youth, JR, is sent to an Australian prison for a minor crime. His cellmate is being sexually abused by a prison gang led by a man named Dave. JR also meets the charismatic Brendan Lynch, a notorious Scottish armed robber. Later, JR finds his cellmate sharpening a shiv to defend himself. When Dave and his gang against the cellmate, move initiates a fight to forestall the attack. Lynch scolds JR for meddling, and soon after, JR's cellmate is again sexually assaulted and commits suicide. When Dave and his gang try to rape JR, Lynch and his men, Sterlo and Merv, rescue JR and kill Dave. In exchange for Lynch's protection during JR's sentence, JR agrees to perform tasks for Lynch once he is paroled.

Upon release six months later, JR meets crime lord Sam and his nephew Josh. JR is given an apartment and а briefcase Lynch's personal effects, including a pistol. A young woman named Tasha arrives at the apartment to give JR cash and a cellphone. Following instructions, JR illegally purchases high-powered firearms and hijacks a scenic tour helicopter. forcing the pilot at gunpoint to extract Lynch and his gang under heavy gunfire. They continue their escape by car, but while Merv buys food at a convenience store, the other three discover from a radio broadcast that Merv lied about being incarcerated for GBH; he actually raped a schoolgirl. Lynch brutally beats Merv and expels him from the gang.

The three head to Sam's estate. There he recruits Lynch and his men to execute a gold heist at Kalgoorlie, with an expected payout in the millions. During a party at the estate, JR spots Tasha, whom he follows to the poolside, where Josh pushes him into the pool. JR, unable to swim, is rescued by Tasha, and the two go to a restaurant. Tasha reveals her relationship with Sam and tells JR that people who run from Sam are killed.

The next morning, Lynch warns JR not to be distracted by Tasha. They then visit the quarry they plan to rob. Lynch tells JR that his role in the heist will be to access the room with the gold and ensure that no employee presses a panic button. Lynch also recruits a rally racer named Chris as the getaway driver.

Back at Sam's estate, the gang plan the heist and a fight breaks out between JR and Josh. JR heads to the bar where he uses his gun to scare away some men who are harassing Tasha. Lacking proper immigration papers, she is angry with JR's impulsiveness, but she proposes meeting at the beach near his house. Later that night, JR sneaks out to meet Tasha; they go into the water and have sex.

The next day, the group infiltrates the quarry and inserts JR into ventilation shaft above the gold room. successfully intimidates employees into not pressing the panic button and lets the rest of the crew in. Lynch tells Josh to guard employees while JR watches the gold poured into bars. This infuriates Josh, who shoots an employee in the leg, whereupon Lynch breaks Josh's nose. police arrive. the disguised as employees, carries six gold bars into the open while holding the real employees at gunpoint. Lynch releases the hostages and opens fire. Chris arrives with the getaway vehicle, but Sterlo is shot. Chris causes two pursuit vehicles to crash and the gang escapes. Sterlo dies after instructing Lynch to give his cut of the heist to his daughter.

Sam betrays Lynch, JR, and Tasha, but the three escape safely and travel to Melbourne, where Sam plans to meet his fence. JR and Lvnch sabotage the rendezvous. killing Sam's henchman and kidnapping Josh. After interrogating him, they find the gold stashed in a storage unit. Lynch and JR kill Sam at his estate, and Lynch offers JR \$350,000 to leave. JR reveals that he realized Lynch would discard him once he had acquired the gold. masterminded a plan to steal the gold with Tasha and take half. Lynch has no choice but to accept JR's terms


and wait, but a woman identifies Lynch, who is captured and jailed. Later JR sends Lynch a message detailing where the gold has been left for him, written on the back of a photo of a pregnant Tasha, hinting at an optimistic future.

assigned to a tour of duty at the titanium ore mining outpost Con-Am 27. operated by the company Con-Amalgamated on the Jovian moon of lo. Conditions on lo are difficult; gravity is 1/6 that of Earth's with no breathable atmosphere, cumbersome spacesuits are with long but limited air. Shifts are significant bonuses are paid. general manager, Mark Sheppard, boasts that productivity has broken all records since he took over. Carol, O'Niel's wife, feels she cannot raise their son Paul on lo and leaves with their child to the Jupiter space station to await a shuttle back to Earth. Tarlow, a miner, suffers an attack of stimulant psychosis - he sees spiders and rips open his spacesuit - resulting in death by explosive decompression. Cane, another miner, enters elevator without his spacesuit during another psychotic episode and dies decompression. With reluctant assistance of Dr. Lazarus, O'Niel investigates the deaths.

Another incident involves a worker. Sagan, who takes a prostitute hostage and threatens to kill her with a knife. O'Niel attempts to calm the man while Montone, his sergeant, sneaks in via the air duct and kills Sagan with a shotgun. O'Niel and Lazarus discover that Sagan had traces of polydichloric euthimal, a powerful amphetaminetype drug in his bloodstream, which would allow а miner to continuously for days at a time until they burn out and turn psychotic after approximately ten months of use. O'Niel uncovers a drug distribution ring run by Sheppard and sanctioned by now repentant Montone.

Using surveillance cameras, O'Niel finds and captures Nicholas Spota, one of Sheppard's dealers, who is murdered before he can be questioned. Montone is found garrotted. In a meat locker, O'Niel



finds the latest shipment of drugs, which was shipped from the space station. He is attacked there by dealer, Russell another Yario. O'Niel, wearing an anti-garrotting collar, knocks him out, then destroys the shipment of drugs. When Sheppard finds out, he threatens O'Niel and contacts his distributor, asking him to send in hitmen. O'Niel professional is hacked prepared, having into Sheppard's communications.

O'Niel waits for the arrival of the hitmen on a supply shuttle from the other side of Jupiter. Realizing what is coming and with only Dr. Lazarus willing to help him, O'Niel sends a message to his family promising to return to Earth when his "job is done". O'Niel ambushes assassins one by one. Lazarus helps him kill the first by trapping him in a pressurized corridor; O'Niel activates a bomb, causing an explosive decompression that kills the man. The second is killed in a glass greenhouse structure of the outpost when O'Niel tricks him into shooting a window, causing it to break open and blow him out to his death.

O'Niel is then confronted and

attacked by Sheppard's inside man one of his own deputies, Sgt. Ballard. The two fight outside the outpost near the satellite structure until O'Niel pulls Ballard's oxygen hose, suffocating him as he pushes him into an electrical generation station, vaporizing him on impact. O'Niel then confronts the surprised Sheppard inside the outpost's recreation bar, knocking him out with one punch. It is implied Sheppard will now be brought to justice or murdered by his own associates. O'Niel, however, already contacted his superiors about Sheppard's associates. some whom are Con-Am executives, and shortly before his departure receives a communication that warrants have been issued for their arrests. O'Niel bids farewell to Lazarus and leaves on the shuttle to join his wife and son on the journey back to Earth.

"Are you a druid?" she said.

"Pardon? Whatever gave you that idea?" I said, slightly bemused. It's not often you get asked a question like that. Not in the stairwell of one of the blocks on Somerset Meadows it isn't.

Her name is Mrs Rivers. She's quite deaf. She screws up her face and watches my mouth when I talk, but she doesn't hear what I'm saying. It's easier and more polite to listen than to talk, so that's what I do. I listen, and I never did find out what made her think I was a druid.

So she launched into this story, about the time she lived in Salisbury and went to Stonehenge for the solstice. This was in 1964, she said. It was very different in those days. There weren't any fences and you could mingle freely with the stones. She went with a friend but they got the date wrong so there was no one there. But then they went back the next night and that's when it all happened.

She was laughing while she told me this.

"And then the druids turned up," she said.
"They all had on those white headdresses, you know, and they were blowing trumpets, up in the air. No one seemed to know what was going on. We were all just milling around waiting for something to happen, and then the sun came up and we

all went home."

I laughed. Not much has changed, I thought. The last time I went to Stonehenge for the solstice the sun came up and we all went home too.

After that Mrs Rivers and I smiled our goodbyes. I carried on down the stairs while she carried on up, and we've never had occasion to talk about Stonehenge again.

Somerset Meadows is where I live. It's a cul-de-sac consisting of a number of red-brick blocks set in spacious communal lawns.

There are no gardens in Somerset Meadows. Every so often a man comes and buzzes round on a sit-down mower cutting the lawn and there are benches lined up on the sunny side of the blocks where people gather in the summer months to drink tea and chat. The small flower beds lining the blocks are tended communally. You get to know your neighbours very well around here. Your neighbours are never very far away.

It's also full of old people.

I don't quite know why that should be. It wasn't designed with old people in mind. Not everyone is old. I just think that, not having gardens to tend, and with a residents

association to take care of the external repairs, it tends to suit older people.

Also I think that some people have been here since it was first built, way back in the 60s.

There's a lot of infirmity and the occasional death to witness.

I've been meditating on mortality ever since I came here.

But I liked Mrs Rivers' story. She went to Stonehenge thirty five years ago, nothing much happened and she still remembers it.

How like life that is.



What made it memorable for Mrs Rivers is that she was at Stonehenge and she saw the druids. They blew their trumpets in the air in the eye of the sun in order to celebrate the moment, turning it

from a mundane event into a magical one.

Which reminds us: there's nothing mundane about a sunrise. It's a cosmic event, meaning that it takes place in the cosmos. It's part of the vast interweaving of the universe in its infinite play, complex and precise. It is only our perspective that makes it appear mundane and it is by our intent that we restore it to its magical glory once more.



"Completely Quackers?"

Is this a fair comment on the Brits and their holiday-time games, muses Alan Dearling

This year the May Bank holiday Duck Race in Todmorden had to be postponed. It was too wet! It then took place a couple of weeks later – despite being another wet day in the Calderdale Valley! As ever, it provided twenty minutes of lively laughs as the plastic ducks, of all sizes, were dropped from into the river from a digger truck sited on road bridge in the



centre of town. The Duck Race was organised from the Tod Market with the Market Tavern landlord, Mark Arrowsmith, acting as the Master of Ceremonies on a mobile PA, calling out a loud, "One – Two – Three. Go!"

Whether a Duck Race is a raffle, a type of lottery, or, a gambling game, is a tad contentious. According to Wikipedia, the Duck Race is a relatively new event, (or, form of





popular madness, perhaps):

"The location and origin of the first Duck Race is unclear... one source stat-

ing it took place in 1987 in Ottawa, Canada, while another says that a charity in Dyserth, Wales, held its first annual Duck Race in 1980."





Certainly, adopting a racing plastic duck and watching it career down a water-course has a quintessentially British feel to it. To my mind it is definitely a modern successor to Poohsticks' racing from A.A. Milne's Winnie the Pooh tale of Pooh's Game. It featured in the 1928 book, 'The House at Pooh Corner'. The bridge from where the Poohsticks were dropped was based on one in Ashdown Forest in East Sussex, which was itself was apparently the archetype for 100 Acre Wood in the Pooh stories.

In the 1960s I well remember building little model rafts with my mate David in Bognor Regis in Sussex and dumping them into the stream known locally as the River Rife. We then followed them from the banks along with David's three dogs. Sometimes we'd add excitement by attempting to 'bomb' the rafts with stones and mud-balls in order to sabotage and sink each other's maritime racing models. Aaah, the nostalgia for the simple pleasures of youth!

In the USA the unofficial record for the United States' duck races stands at over 200,000 ducks in Cincinnati which briefly raced in the Ohio River and raised more than a million dollars for the local foodbank. According to Wikipedia, "The biggest duck race so far has taken place on London's River Thames on 31 August 2008. It was called the Great British Duck Race, with 250,000 blue rubber ducks in usage."

Blue ducks were used after some spectators had dropped their own 'forged' traditional yellow ducks into the River Thames near the finishing line in a previous race leading to much confusion.

Here is the rest of the sequence of photos from the Todmorden annual charity fund -raising event. At the finishing line some rogue ducks and ducklings made a Great Escape, despite spectators on the bridge yelling out to the two Duck Race organisers in the river, "They are BEHIND you!!!"

Possibly because we were too peculiar and stupid to fail.





LEON ALVARADO THE CHANGING TIDE MELODIC REVOLUTION

Keyboard player, drummer and singer Leon Alvarado has returned with his latest album which is very much a homage to the mighty Pink Floyd, something which is obvious from the first of the six songs through to the last which is a cover of "Brain Damage" and the only one to feature vocals. We even get small sound additions such as the ticking of a clock, a heartbeat etc which ensures the listener understands fully where the influences are coming from. To assist him in this

endeavour, Leon has brought in bassists Tony Franklin and Gary Gnaedinger, guitarists Edoardo Scordo and Damian Darlington (both members of Brit Floyd, who say they produce the world's greatest Pink Floyd show), alongside Jimmy Griggers (guitars) and saxophonist John Helliwell (Supertramp). Additionally, L.A. session musician Pablo Hopehayn contributes on strings and the backing vocals on "Brain Damage" are provided by Jeff Sanson, Liz Hall, and Linda Alvarado. I mean, just listen to the first half of "A Day of a Different Sort" and one would think this is a lost track from 'Dark Side' with Gilmour guitars, Waters bass and Wright-style keyboards. This song, more than any, moves from being influenced by Floyd to attempting very hard indeed to recreate the classic sound, not as a parody but as a homage.

There will be some Floyd fans who will be horrified that someone has attempted to reproduce the sound so closely, but for the most part there will be many others who are incredibly pleased in hearing this style being brought back to life, much more so than many of the bands who treat them more as an influence, such as RPWL. This is not a covers band, as most of the tracks are original, but when they

want to move in that direction Leon is more than happy to oblige with a stunning rendition of "Brain Damage" to close it out. It may not be truly original, but then little is these days, and if you are a fan of classic Floyd then there is a great deal here to enjoy.




MATT JOE GOW THE WOODSHED SESSIONS INDEPENDENT

I have been fortunate to see Matt play in concert a few times, twice as totally solo and one with Kerryn Fields and his Dead Leaves bandmate Andy Pollock. This acoustic session finds him with just Andy and long-time Dead Leaves member Katya Horrop, recording live in the studio on September 1st, 2023, with everything just one take with no overdubs. The three of them have been working together for years, and it shows in this set of songs taken from his award-winning albums, stripped back with the three musicians linked in as well, with Matt's wonderfully worn and broad vocals contrasting greatly with the sweet voice of Katya who harmonises wonderfully with him when the time is right.

A singer and a single instrument will always be the purest form of music for me, and I feel incredibly lucky to have seen Melbourne-based Gow play so many times in Auckland. He is at his most poignant when it is him and his guitar, and here the additional piano/banjo etc are

nuanced and adding to the emotion without distracting from it. The title cut of his last studio release, "Between Tonight & Tomorrow" is evocative, passionate and full of fragile strength. It is no wonder that his alt country style has won him so many accolades in both the country where he now resides and the country of his birth as there is a depth of feeling here which is honest and calls to the hearts of the listener. The last time I saw him play I phoned my wife and let her listen to what was taking place, and she was blown away by what she heard, something that is true of all fans of this style of music. He may not be from the Deep South of America, but he is from Dunedin and that is pretty much the same thing (-45.87416, 170.50361), and this is an album I can play time and time again. Matt writes songs which are relevant and full of pathos, and he has friends around him how fully understand what he wants to achieve and enables him to do just that. This is essential for all fans of modern country, full of soul and heart.



MATT JOE GOW & KERRYN FIELDS I REMEMBER YOU OILY RAG RECORDS

Matt and Kerryn may now be residents of Melbourne in Victoria, but they both grew up in Aoteaora, Matt on South Island and Kerryn on the North. They are both wellknown in their new home, with Matt's

'Between Tonight and Tomorrow' winning Music Victoria's Best Country Album 2023, while Kerryn's 'Water' won Music Victoria's Best Folk Album 2022. Here have combined they songwriting skills in an album which is alt country with some folk influences, even covering some NZ royalty in Sir Dave Dobbyn's "It Dawned on Me" (how can that song be 30 years old now?). They have brought in a host of musicians to help them achieve their dreams, with Matt's Dead Leaves bandmate Andy Pollock very much at the heart of things, and it was this trio which I saw performing together to promote the album last year.

This album was only released at the beginning of May, but songs from it have been winning awards and recognition over the last year, yet while I enjoyed it, I found myself comparing Kerryn's vocals to Katya Horrop with whom Matt often performs as part of Dead Leaves, and I must confess I much prefer Katya's. That may be due to the genre, as I do not know Kerryn's own music, only what she has performed with Matt, but to my ears their voices do not always blend well together. She has a vocal style of her own, and I am sure that comes across better when not being placed with such a strong male performer as Matt. Given the huge kudos this album has received I am sure I am very much in the minority, and there are plenty of people out there calling this a masterpiece, but while there are some absolute classics on here such as "Heart of Gold", where Kerryn's vocals work very well indeed, there are plenty of others where they do not. Given the amount of publicity this album has been gaining I only hope it helps break them through into a much wider audience, but only time will tell if this project has longevity or if they decide to work in future as solo artists. For fans of alt country.



MELANIE MAU & MARTIN SCHNELLA THE RAINBOW TREEINDEPENDENT

I have long been a fan of Melanie and Martin, who not only work together in multiple progressive rock bands but have also been producing wonderful albums where they take well-known songs and turn them into something quite different indeed. I have never been a fan of bands attempting to reproduce note for note, especially in a studio, a song which has been already been a hit. One of my very favourite covers is "Hotel California" by Alabama 3 who took the classic and made it something far darker and twisted – it is the taking of something and making it their own which makes the art of doing so totally worthwhile, and that is always the case with Melanie and Martin.

When the CD arrived, I was immediately taken by the bright artwork and opened up the digipak to discover a business card and a QR code which I immediately scanned and was delighted to find that as well as the original 14 songs there were another 11 alternate versions which could be downloaded free of charge, one of which was a song not included on the main release. The core band for this album is Martin Schnella (vocals, acoustic guitars, additional percussion), Melanie Mau (vocals), Mathias Ruck (vocals), Lars Lehmann (bass, fretless bass) and Simon Schröder (percussion) plus they have assorted guests (including none other than Dave Meros). What makes this such an insanely enjoyable album is that they have put their own stamp onto it so much that if one did not know any of the songs then one would think this was an album of originals as they all fit seamlessly into the same pattern. This is prog folk, mostly acoustic with an electric bass and built wonderful vocals, sometimes are singular, and others are wonderful three-part harmonies. Given the background of those involved it will be no surprise to find covers of the likes of Gentle Giant, Neal Morse, Peter Gabriel, but they move all over the place musically so Massive Attack sits happily alongside Porcupine Tree and Nightwish, but Iron Maiden? I have been a fan of Maiden since 1980 and was fortunate enough to see them on the 'Beast on the Road' tour in 1982, which is where I first heard "Hallowed Be Thy Name", but it never sounded like this, and it has been paired with "For The Greater Good of God" from 2006's 'A Matter of Life and Death', which works very well indeed. This is aggressive acoustic music which takes the original and drives new beauty into a subject which has always been emotional, taking it to new levels.

Starting with Gentle Giant and ending with a traditional number which has been performed by the likes of Clannad, this album is a thing of beauty and joy. That we then get to hear different versions of many of the songs again before ending now with Damn Yankees really is the icing on the cake. Whatever you may think of cover versions, take it from me this is no Guns 'n' Roses doing "Knockin' on Heaven's Door" but instead is taking songs we know and turning them into something which now belongs to Melanie Mau and Martin Schnella – truly superb, and totally essential.



NEAL MORSE THE RESTORATION – JOSEPH: PART TWO FRONTIERS

I strongly felt Neal's last album was a real return to form after his previous Christian musical, 'Jesus Christ The Exorcist', which was for me one of his weakest releases, although to be fair I do not think it is possible for Morse to put out a truly poor album. Needless to say, I have been looking forward to hearing this, and at long last we have the concluding part of the well-known story. 'The Dreamer -Joseph: Part One' finished with Joseph imprisoned, and in 'The Restoration - Joseph: Part Two,' we find him becoming the viceroy of Egypt and reuniting with his family. Neal assumes the lead vocalist role, plus there are a host of guests including Nick D'Virgilio (Spock's Beard, Big Big Train), Ted Leonard (Spock's Beard, Pattern Seeking Animals, Enchant), Matt Smith (Theocracy), Ross Jennings (Haken), Jake Livgren (Proto-Kaw, Emerald City Council) and Alan Morse (Spock's Beard), along with members of the Neal Morse Band, such as Bill Hubauer and Eric Gillette.

It must be said that some of this does seem somewhat like Morse by numbers, and there is no doubt we have previously heard the vocal approach on "The Argument" on songs like "Gibberish" – it is very clever but there is definitely the feeling we have come across this before. It is a shame as the driving guitar which precedes it is simply wonderful, and then we morph into "Make Like a Breeze" where we are into classic driving prog which makes me almost forgive what just came before. The man is a genius, of that there is no doubt, but when working in a multi-instrumentalist fashion there is always the risk of not taking on new ideas and falling back on what is safe. The result is an album I have thoroughly enjoyed but is not at the heights of being truly indispensable, and given how much I enjoyed the first part I must admit to being somewhat disappointed. understand that Neal feels it is his duty to keep spreading the word of Christianity as it is incredibly important to him, and over the years he has released some truly great albums (seeing him perform 'Testimony' in London was a very special event indeed), but if he is going to have the impact he desires then he also needs to rethink his musical approach, as while there are times when this is truly brilliant there are also others where we feel we have heard it before and are looking for something new.

It may not have been the brilliant conclusion I was looking for, but it is still worthy of investigation for those like me who have followed his career with interest ever since the arrival of 'The Light' all those years ago.



NOAGE FROM DARKNESS TO LIFE REVALVE RECORDS

Earlier this year I reviewed the debut


album by keyboard player and singer Massimo Pieretti, 'A New Beginning', and he has now sent me the debut album from one of the bands he is in. Noage. Formed by singer Germana Noage (Aetherna), the rest of the line-up is Massimo (keyboards), bassist Michele Raspanti (Graal, S.O.S., ex-Tular, ex-Secret Rule), guitarist Michele "El Diablo" Serra (Mindcrime, ex- Daylight Silence), and drummer Andres Gualco (Darker, ex-Tersivel). They released a single in 2021, and another in 2022, neither of which appear on this release which came out at the end of 2023. They describe their music as, "metal with gothic hues but which pays great attention to the melodies, never banal arrangements with influences ranging from Nightwish to early Queensrÿche and Fates Warning".

There is no doubt that Germana is a professionally trained singer with a great range, but she is less Tarja Turunen or Floor Jansen and more Anette Olzon although she sings in a higher level. This is commercial symphonic metal, and I must admit not hearing much in the way of gothic overtones, although there are some nice banks of keyboard sounds. The drums are thundering with nice triplets and fills, Andres is obviously someone who is always looking to add to music as opposed to just sitting at the back and being a human metronome, while bassist Raspanti switches between providing foundation and counter melodies to keep it interesting. With that foundation behind them, Serra can crunch away with nice riffs, attacking the music while Pieretti gives us the curtain of sounds with Germana in full control at all times.

"Never Too Late" is a more dynamic piece with far more space within, showing a very different side of the band. It also features a guest in Kate Nord whose vocals take the song in a very different direction — she also performed on Massimo Pieretti's solo album, and her appearance here is both a delight and a surprise (what an operatic range she has). We also get a guest guitarist on


"Superhero" where Francesco Mattei (Noveria) joins to bring us another attack. That we finish with the biting and hard-hitting number "Fuck The World" which is packed full of aggression is nothing but a delight as the band lay it on the line, knowing it is never going to get airplay but is sure to be a favourite in concert.


If you enjoy female-fronted symphonic metal by the likes of Epica and Nightwish then this is a band to look out for, available on Bandcamp.





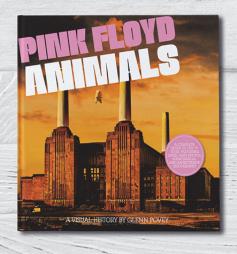
I hope you enjoyed this issue. I'm really rather proud of it, and I look forward to seeing you all in a couple of weeks.

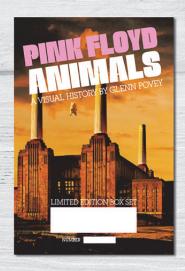
